

### **Welcome to Doggie Days Daycare**

Enclosed is your Registration Packet for daycare. Please have all forms completed prior to your scheduled evaluation. At the evaluation a staff member will review the materials with you and answer any questions you may have.

  - Each dog attending the program must have a separate application filled out. Please specify the number of applications you will need.

Please have the above forms completed prior to your evaluation appointment. In addition, if your pet isn't already a patient of Animal Health Care Center, we will require a copy of your dog's most current records. The daycare program requires proof of the following:

- Rabies Vaccination
- Distemper/Parvo Vaccination
- Bordetella Vaccination
- Canine Influenza Bivalent Vaccination (covering H3N2 and H3N8)
- Heartworm Testing (for dogs over 1 year of age)
- Intestinal Parasite Screen
- Heartworm Prevention
- Flea/Tick Prevention

Your dog's first visit to the daycare program will be an evaluation (by appointment only). The fee for this evaluation is \$22. During the evaluation a member of the daycare team will spend time with your pet, learning their personality, and introducing to different play groups to find where they fit in best. Your dog will receive the equivalent of a half day of daycare with the evaluation. Please call 256-801-2529 to schedule your pet's evaluation.

### **Doggie Daycare Information**

### **Benefits of Doggie Daycare include:**

- Daycare is a great way to socialize your dog, especially if you have a puppy or shy dog. Puppies are very
  impressionable and the more they are socialized the more likely they will grow up to be well-adjusted
  dogs. If you have a shy dog, daycare can be a great tool to help your dog build his or her confidence and
  adjust to other dogs and people. Just remember it can take time for a shy dog to get used to daycare and
  really enjoy themselves.
- Daycare is an excellent way to exercise your dog, although we do not recommend having your dog participate in daycare every day. Daycare is very exhausting and your dog needs some time off to catch up on sleep. Additionally, doing daycare every day can lead to guarding behavior in some dogs, which is not something we want to see in our daycare environment.
- Even dogs that are more mellow and do not enjoy non-stop play benefit from the mental stimulation they get from daycare. There is always lots to watch and new smells to check out in daycare.
- Daycare can help with dogs who suffer from separation anxiety. It gives your dog a place to go during the day when you cannot be with them and provides both mental and physical stimulation which will make them tired and more receptive to the training you do at home to overcome anxiety.

#### Inherent risks of Daycare include:

- Daycare is really no different than sending a child to school. Every child catches a cold or the flu at some point, and some children have better immune systems than others. The biggest difference between your dog and a child is that your dog cannot tell you a day or two before they are showing signs of being sick that their throat feels scratchy and often it is the days before they act or look sick that they are the most contagious. When we do know of something going around we will attempt to notify all parents of dogs that may have been exposed. We also ask for help from the parents, as you are more likely to notice the subtle changes in your dog that indicate they might be feeling a little off, and if you notice these signs we ask that you refrain from bringing your dog to daycare. However, even with us being very diligent in trying to prevent the spread of a virus or bacteria that makes our dogs sick it still cannot be completely prevented.
- Daycare is similar to contact sports for humans, except these participants are playing the game with their teeth and claws. The more active a player your dog is the more likely they will get scratches and other marks on them. There is a playgroup supervisor in group with the dogs at all times and we monitor each group to keep play levels as safe as possible, but sometimes things do happen. If we notice anything, we will point it out to you, but remember they are covered in hair and we will not see everything. If you find a mark you feel may be concerning, please let us know.
- The closer a dog is in contact with other dogs the more likely they are to come into contact with fleas, ticks, or other external parasites--this is why we require all daycare participants to be current on flea and tick prevention. But even being current on prevention, dogs can pick up stragglers that have not yet fallen off or been killed by the medication. If you find fleas or ticks on your dog, let us know and we can decide whether or not to recommend using a different or additional prevention.
- After a day of daycare, your dog will most likely go home hungry, thirsty, and tired. This is normal. During play, dogs might not take the time to stop and drink as much as they should. We always have fresh water available but many dogs are too distracted with playing. Do not be surprised if your dog goes home, eats, and passes out. This too is normal and is probably one of the primary reasons you bring your dog to daycare. Because dogs in daycare often do not take the time to take a break, we do nap rotations in the morning and afternoon. The naps give the dogs a break from play and each other, but they are still going to need extra sleep at home.

### **DOGGIE DAYCARE LIABILITY AGREEMENT**

### (Please initial before each paragraph to indicate you've read and understood each one.)

Clawington of Madison (CLA) agrees to exercise reasonable care with regard to Owner's pet; however, Owner agrees that CLA is not responsible for disease to pet, injury or death to pet caused by another animal, escape of pet or injury or harm to any persons or to any property by pet. Owner understands that the concept of dog daycare is to allow dogs to be socialized by interacting with people and dogs. Additionally, Owner grants permission for pets enrolled in the daycare to be housed in cages or kennels.
The pet must be current on the following vaccinations: Rabies, Distemper/Parvo, Bordetella, Influenza, Heartworm Testing, and Intestinal Parasite Screening. If vaccinations/labs were not performed at Animal Health Care Center, valid proof must be presented before the pet will be accepted by CLA and Owner agrees to keep CLA informed of any updates to vaccinations. Pets arriving with fleas/ticks will be treated at Owner's expense. CLA reserves the right to refuse any pet.
Should any pet in CLA's care become ill or seem to be in need of medical consideration, CLA reserves the right to have Animal Health Care Center administer aid. Any expenses incurred as a result shall be paid by the Owner. If a life-threatening injury or death occurs, CLA will make reasonable efforts to notify Owner immediately and receive specific instruction on how to proceed. If the Owner cannot be reached or an injury is life threatening, the pet will be treated by Animal Health Care Center at Owner's expense.
Collars and Leashes: All dogs must be on a leash when entering and exiting CLA. All dogs must be wearing QUICK RELEASE collar. For safety reasons, we cannot allow them to wear buckle collars.
Beds and Toys: You may not bring your dog's own toys and beds from home because this could cause possessive behavior.
Owner agrees to pay the rate for services in effect on the date the pet is checked into CLA. Prices are subject to change at any time without notice. No pet will be released until all charges are paid in full.
It is expressly agreed upon by the Owner and CLA that CLA's liability shall in no event exceed the lesser of the current tangible value of a pet of the same species or veterinary fees. The Owner further agrees to be solely responsible for any and all acts or behaviors of pet while in the care of CLA, and Owner will defend and hold CLA harmless from any claims, damages, or injury or other liability resulting from Owner's acts or omissions or from those of Owner's pet. The Owner of the pet agrees to pay reasonable attorney fees incurred by CLA in the collections of any charges incurred by the Owner of the pet for services rendered at CLA/ Animal Health Care Center.
Owner agrees that their pet will be picked up by Owner or a pre-approved Owner's agent by 5:30pm, or Owner will be responsible for charges incurred for boarding the pet and the pet will not be available to be picked up until regular business hours of Clawington.
Owner agrees that their pet may be videotaped, photographed, and recorded. CLA shall be the exclusive owner to the results and all proceeds of such tapings, photography, and recordings with the rights, throughout the world, an unlimited number of times in perpetuity, to copyright, to use and to license to others in any manner. The Owner further agrees that their pet may be used in any and all media and in the promotion, advertising, sale, publicizing and exploitation of CLA.
The person signing this agreement warrants that he or she is the Owner of the pet or is Owner's agent for purposes of delivering the pet to CLA and has Owner's authority to enter into this Agreement on Owner's behalf.
